Key headlines

- In the three months to January, average rental values for new tenancies in the UK were 8.9% higher than the same period last year
- The annual growth in average rental values for the three months to January were higher than 2014 (8.9%), 2013 (3.8%), 2012 (4%) and 2011 (2.9%)
- In the three months to January 2015, average tenant incomes were 6.2% higher than in 2014
- Average rents for new tenancies in London are 12.3% higher than the same period last year
- Average rental values in the 3 months to January for new tenancies in London (£1,412pcm) were £155 more expensive per month when compared to average rental values in the same period in 2014 (£1,257pcm)
- When London is excluded, the average UK rental value in the 3 months to January was £702pcm - this is 3.7% higher than the same period last year (£677pcm)

The figures also show...


- The average UK rent for tenancies in January 2015 was £889pcm, this is 11.2% higher than January 2014 (£799pcm)
- When London is excluded, the average UK rental value was £702pcm this is 3.7% higher than last year (£677pcm)
- Most regions saw an increase in average rental values, compared to last year, particularly Greater London (12.3%) and Scotland (10.8%) and South West (7.3%)
- Greater London, South East and South West have seen continuing increase in rental values over the last 12 months
- Regions to see reductions when compared to last year are the Wales by 1.4% and North West by 1%






Rental values and tenant incomes in the three months to January

Annual UK tenant income over the last three months, with annual comparisons




The figures also show...

- In the three months to January, average rental values for new tenancies were 8.9% higher than the same period last year (£878pcm compared to £806pcm)
- The annual growth in average rental values for the three months to January (8.9%) was higher than 2014 (3.8%) and 2013 (4%)
- In the three months to January 2015, average tenant incomes were 6.2% higher than 2014




Greater London v. the rest of the UK

The figures also show...

- From December 2014 to January 2015, average rental values in the capital have risen by 2.3%
- Rents in London were 13.4% higher in January 2015, compared to last year
- Average rental values for new tenancies in London (£1,425pcm) were £168 more expensive in January 2015, when compared to average rental values in January 2014 (£1,257pcm)



As well as information on rental amounts, the HomeLet Rental Index also provides information on tenant demographics, such as their average age, income, previous residential status and the property type they're applying to live in.

In addition, we gather data on how many people share rented properties – so we're able to gain an insight into the lifestyle of tenants, and see how external factors, such as the lack of mortgage availability, plus supply of, and demand for, rented homes are affecting how and where people live.

Data is gathered from our tenant referencing service, and our rental amounts are based on actual achieved rental prices with accurate tenancy start dates in a reported month, rather than advertised costs. We reference up to 1,700 applicants every day – so information in the report is comprehensive, accurate and up to date.
