- · 2016 to date has seen a slower rate of rental growth, compared to last year
- The average UK rental value was £902pcm this is 3.0% higher than last year (£875pcm)
- · Rents in Greater London are up by 2.5% year on year
- Average rental values have increased in eleven out of twelve regions in the UK, compared to the same period last year

HomeLet Rental Index provides comprehensive and up to date data on new tenancies in the UK. Data is gathered from our tenant referencing service, including the rental amounts agreed, the number of tenants moving into the property together with the employment status, income and age of all tenants. The trends reported within the HomeLet Rental Index are brand new tenancies which were arranged in the most recent period, giving the most relevant insight into changes in the Private Rented Sector.

It's interesting to note...

• The average UK rental value was £902pcm - this is 3.0% higher than the same period last year (£875pcm) and a reduction in the rate of increase seen in October 2015 (4.0%)

It's interesting to note...

 The UK average rental value has reduced by 0.9% since September 2016 – this is comparable to the monthly variance in October 2015 (-0.9%) and more than October 2014 (-0.2%)





- In October 2016 average rental values in London (£1,542) were 71.0% higher than the UK (£902)
- The gap between London and the rest of the UK was comparable to October 2015 (71.8%) and lower than October 2014 (66.8%)





Data is gathered from our tenant referencing service, and our rental amounts are based on actual achieved rental prices with accurate tenancy start dates in a reported month, rather than advertised costs. The data used in the HomeLet Rental Index is aggregated to regional, county and city level only. This ensures that all property or individual records remain strictly anonymous.

The HomeLet Rental Index is prepared from information that we consider is collated with careful attention, but we do not make any statement as to its accuracy or completeness.
