

## HomeLet Rental Index

## Key headlines

- The second half of 2016 has seen a considerably slower rate of rental growth, compared to the same period in 2015
- The average UK rental value was £892pcm this is 1.7% higher than the same period last year (£877pcm)
- Since July 2016, rents in Greater London have seen a slower pace of annual growth than last year
- This month the average rental value in Greater London is 2.0% higher than the same period last year
- Average rental values have increased in eleven out of twelve regions in the UK, compared to the same period last year



## **December 2016 edition**

HomeLet Rental Index provides comprehensive and up to date data on new tenancies in the UK. Data is gathered from our tenant referencing service, including the rental amounts agreed, the number of tenants moving into the property together with the employment status, income and age of all tenants. The trends reported within the HomeLet Rental Index are brand new tenancies which were arranged in the most recent period, giving the most relevant insight into changes in the Private Rented Sector.

#### It's interesting to note ...

• The average UK rental value was £892pcm - this is 1.7% higher than the same period last year (£877pcm) and a reduction in the rate of increase seen in December 2015 (3.8%)

#### It's interesting to note ...

• The UK average rental value has reduced by 0.6% since November 2016 – this is lower than the monthly variance in December 2015 (+0.5%) and December 2014 (+0.6%)













## Monthly variation between Greater London rental prices and the UK average




#### The figures also show...

- In December 2016 average rental values in London (£1,508) were 69% higher than the UK (£892)
- The gap between London and the rest of the UK was comparable to December 2015 (68.5%) and higher than December 2014 (65.9%)

The data used in the HomeLet Rental Index is aggregated to regional, county and city level only. This ensures that all property or individual records remain strictly anonymous.
