Condition of the property

Signs of damp...

- ✓ Look for signs of damp in the corners, under the windows and on the ceiling
- ✓ Check for a damp or musty smell (particularly in cellars and inside cupboards)
- ✓ Look for peeling wallpaper



Look for rot

- ✓ Lift any rugs or floor coverings to see whether floorboards are sound
- ✓ Inspect window frames and sills for signs of rot

Internal

- ✓ See how well the floor space is used and imagine your belongings there
- ✓ Check the walls for any cracks. Hairline cracks are common, but you shouldn't
 be able to fit a coin in
- ✓ Carefully look at the condition of the carpets
- ✓ Check the standards of locks on doors and windows
- ✓ Ask whether there's an alarm system
- ✓ Open and close doors and windows to see whether they 'stick'
- ✓ Ask whether the windows are doubled glazed
- ✓ Look at how much in-built storage there is (particularly in the kitchen)
- ✓ Check for power sockets, phone lines and T.V. points
- ✓ Make sure you get mobile phone reception

External

- ✓ If there's a garden, check whose responsibility it is
- ✓ Check the Environment Agency's <u>flooding map</u> to see if the area has been flooded recently
- ✓ Look to see whether the house has an aerial or what type of aerial you'd need in that area
