

HomeLet Rental Index

Key headlines

- 2016 to date has seen a slower rate of rental growth, compared to the same period last year
- The average UK rental value was £898pcm this is 3.1% higher than the same period last year (£872pcm)
- This month the lowest annual growth was seen in Greater London (1.6%) and the East Midlands (1.6%)
- Average rental values have increased in all regions in the UK, compared to the same period last year
- In November 2016, the UK household rent to income ratio was 27.7%



November 2016 edition

HomeLet Rental Index provides comprehensive and up to date data on new tenancies in the UK. Data is gathered from our tenant referencing service, including the rental amounts agreed, the number of tenants moving into the property together with the employment status, income and age of all tenants. The trends reported within the HomeLet Rental Index are brand new tenancies which were arranged in the most recent period, giving the most relevant insight into changes in the Private Rented Sector.

It's interesting to note...

• The average UK rental value was £898pcm - this is 3.1% higher than the same period last year (£872pcm) and a reduction in the rate of increase seen in October 2015 (3.8%)

It's interesting to note...

 The UK average rental value has reduced by 0.4% since October 2016 – this is the same as the monthly variance in November 2015 (-0.4%) and marginally higher than November 2014 (-0.2%)





- The gap between London and the rest of the UK was lower than November 2015 (71.7%) and higher than November 2014 (65.5%)





Data is gathered from our tenant referencing service, and our rental amounts are based on actual achieved rental prices with accurate tenancy start dates in a reported month, rather than advertised costs. The data used in the HomeLet Rental Index is aggregated to regional, county and city level only. This ensures that all property or individual records remain strictly anonymous.
